

## B2B mortgage email instruction guide

From time to time, you may receive an encrypted email from us. We'll usually encrypt an email when it contains confidential information and we want to make sure you receive it securely. We aren't planning to replace our regular forms of communication (post, telephone and fax) with emails, and you may not receive secure emails from us at all. However, if you do receive an encrypted email from us, you may need to take a few additional steps in order to view it. We've included a guide on how to do this below.



## Receiving an encrypted email


When you receive an encrypted email from us, there will be an attachment (a .html file) that you need to open or download, depending on your email client and computer system.

Your encrypted message is on an attachment.



When you have opened the .html file, you will see the following message, inviting you to sign in (if you have a Microsoft account) or request a one-time passcode.

For the rest of this tutorial, we'll assume you don't have a Microsoft account and need to request a one-time passcode.



## **One Time Pass Codes**

This simply means that you request a passcode for each email we send to you. It does not mean that you can only request one pass code, or that one code will work every time you want to view an email. Every time you want to view a secure email we send to you, you need to follow this process. Each passcode is valid for 15 minutes. Once you have selected 'request one time pass code', you will be taken to the screen below.

**Important:** You can only use the pass code that matches the reference code. If you have requested the pass code twice, the email you should use for the pass code is the one where the reference code matches the reference code on screen has the reference showing on screen. Remember, each pass code is valid for 15 minutes only.

The email will then show, along with any attachments, for you to use as normal. You may also see a files that start with 'ATT'. These are part of the email signature and can be ignored.
